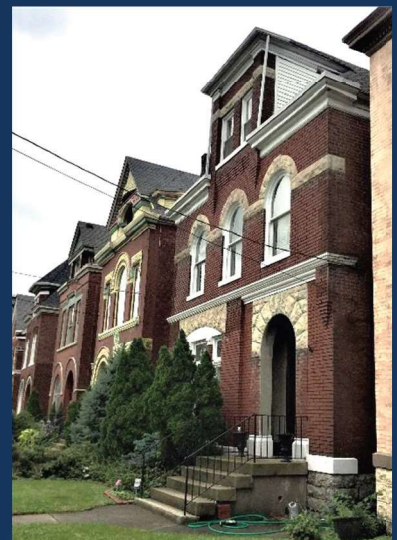

Exterior property changes within Preservation Districts must be approved by the Landmarks Commission staff or Architectural Review Committee (ARC) and meet the Design Guidelines **before** work has begun.



Common exterior changes requiring a review include, but are not limited to,

- Signs
- Decks
- Fences
- Windows
- Doors
- Siding
- Painting masonry
- Retaining walls

Most changes to a property can be approved by staff, but some major changes may be approved by the ARC, which is comprised of fellow citizens. All approved work receives a Certificate of Appropriateness (COA).
